

Regular verb endings

To form the present tense of a regular verb drop the –en or n ending from the infinitive and add –e, -st, -t, or -en/-n to the stem.

Ex. Studierst du Physik?

Regular verbs whose stem ends in –d or –t add an –e before the endings – st – or –t for pronunciation.

Ex. Lena arbeitet in der Bibliothek.

Die Zeitung kostet zu viel.

know your prepositions in the accusative. Here they are again:
